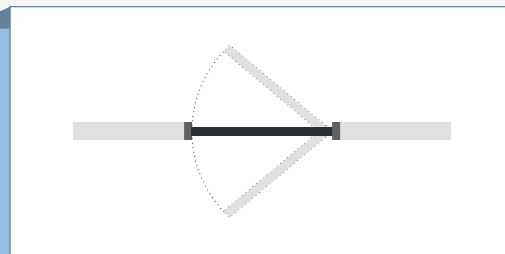


SWING DOOR

Hallway

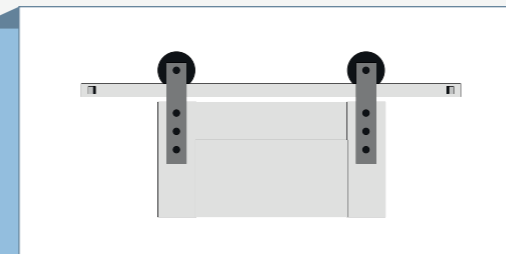
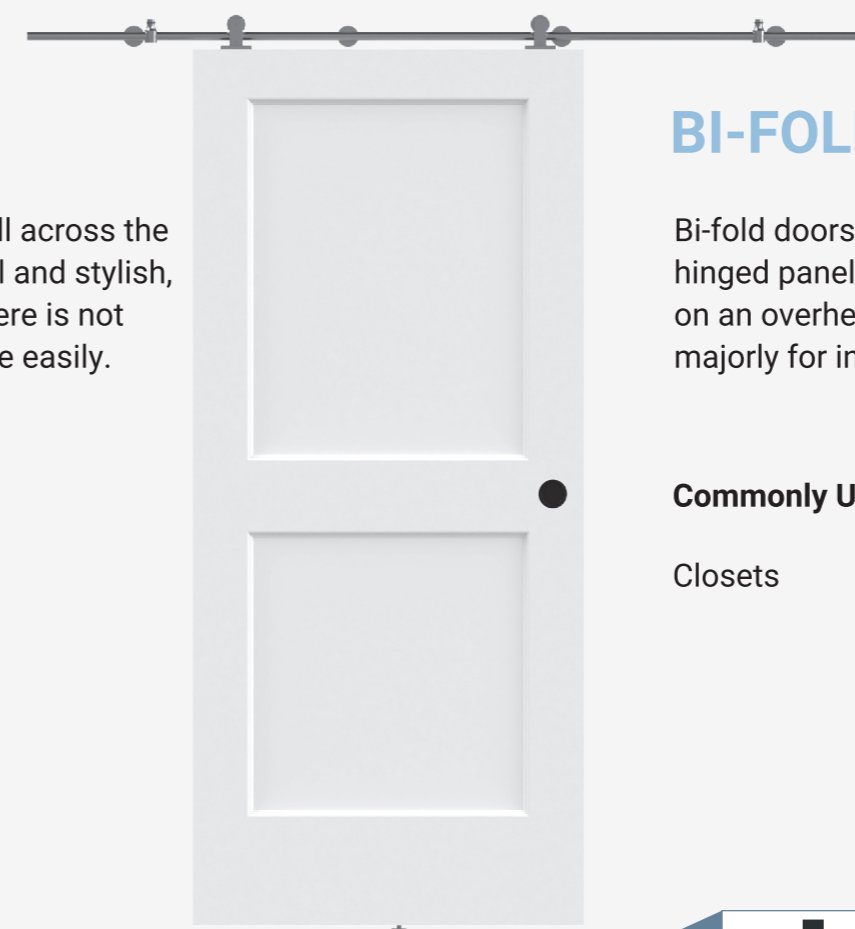


BARN DOOR

A barn door is a type of sliding door. These doors roll across the opening with the help of overhead tracks. Functional and stylish, barn doors are suited for interior locations where there is not enough space for traditional doors to open and close easily.

Multi-Use Spaces | Bathrooms

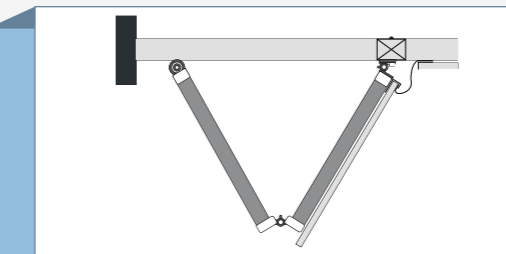


BI-FOLD DOOR

Bi-fold doors as the name suggest have two or more folding hinged panels which fold into one side of the frame and slide on an overhead or bottom track. They are used as room dividers majorly for interior locations.

Commonly Used Locations :

Closets

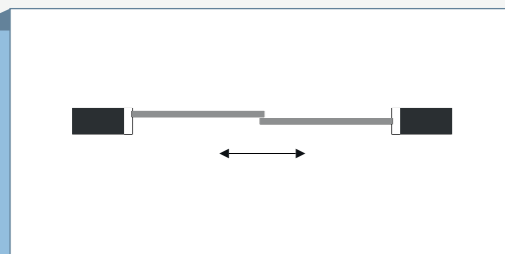


BY-PASS DOOR

By-pass doors are sliding doors that are set on two (or more) different overhead or floor tracks, one in front and the other behind it. The doors open and close by sliding in front of each other. These doors are ideal for interior or exterior locations with a wide opening but less wall space.

Commonly Used Locations :

Closets | Patio

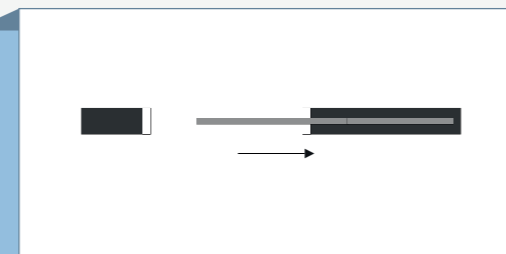


POCKET DOOR

Pocket doors are doors that slide inside a pocket in the wall. These doors function with the help of an overhead or a floor track inside a wall. When the door is open the panels are not visible as they are hidden in the pocket. They are ideal for interior locations with limited space.

Bathrooms | Closets | Utility Closets
Walk-in Closets | Fitness Rooms
